He has been coaching players of all levels for the past 15 years. Over the past 12 years he has managed local tennis programs at Hollyburn Country Club as well as Vancouver Lawn Tennis & Badminton Club and is one of Canada's leading young coaches. He was a national level player in Serbia, followed by a tennis scholarship in the US before moving to Vancouver, Canada and devoting himself to his coaching career in BC.

Uros creates change in a players' tennis game in a friendly yet highly effective way of communicating and believes that everyone can improve – at all levels of play.

He has just written a book "Mine!" as an illustrated guide to Women's Doubles Play and has chosen to visit our Club as part of his book tour, bringing his coaching expertise to our tennis players on the Coast, so do spread the word amongst your friends. Would be great to get your regular group of four to be coached together, and see the difference.
